Re: School fees academic year 2021-2022

It is the custom of the Board of Governors to provide parents with as much notice as possible regarding the fees for the forthcoming academic year. This letter sets out the fees for the coming academic year, commencing September 2021.

The COVID-19 pandemic has afforded much uncertainty for families and for businesses. Disruption to the school's operations has been met with exceptional resilience and determination, from the whole school community, with a dedication to providing the best possible outcomes for all More House pupils, in line with the school's Outstanding gradings, maintained in all Ofsted inspection categories. Such excellence for pupils remains core to the school's planning and priorities, guiding decision-making in the present and for the future within a culture of continuous evaluation and improvement.

As with last academic year, the current year's impact on families has focused the attentions of the governors and the school's leadership team on a comprehensive examination of all expenditure in order to realise special financial support to families meeting school fees through private means, and we have been very pleased to have managed to afford such help, recognising the uncertainties faced by so many of our parents during such challenging times nationally.

Discounts made available:

I am pleased that, in setting the 2021-22 fees, we have been able to maintain the 10% discount for siblings, and a 10% discount for Sixth Formers from the day fee element of their tuition for each year a student has previously been in the school prior to entering the Sixth Form, up to a maximum of 50%.

The Board of Governors is confident that these fees represent unparalleled value for money whilst ensuring the sustainability of More House School to continue to deliver its exceptional provision for all pupils, empowering them to command their futures.

We remain ever grateful of parents' sacrifice, and committed support of their sons and the school.
