Aspiration triumphs over adversity

Upper Sixth students from nationally-celebrated More House School, Frensham, are celebrating exceptional success in their public exams and university entry, having overcome the barriers posed by their special educational needs.

Despite a majority holding an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) recognising significant difficulties with learning, 81% of More House leavers applied to university. All secured places and will study courses as varied as Acting, Animal Behaviour, Architecture, Biomedicine, Biochemistry, Computer Games Design, Computer Science and Cybersecurity, Film, Mechanical Engineering, Paramedic Science, Politics and Television Production and Media.

More House's headmaster, Jonathan Hetherington, congratulated his students on their tenacity in the face of challenge. He praised the school's extensive staff of specialist therapists and teachers, explaining "holding high aspirations for our pupils is at the core of our school's powerful ethos". He added "our students benefit from committed, creative and energetic teachers, therapists and pastoral staff, who teach our boys to recognise their strengths and be courageous".

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As exam-results nationally have adjusted downwards to bring statistics in line with pre-pandemic levels, the achievements of More House's leavers this summer are especially impressive. 90% of More House's A' Level and equivalent Level 3 BTEC grades were passes, with 55% at C grade or higher.

Rated Outstanding in every aspect by Ofsted in March 2023, More House School is registered charity and independent boarding and day school, recognised internationally as a centre of excellence in supporting intelligent boys aged eight to 18 to transform their futures and overcome the barriers posed by Specific Learning Difficulties, Developmental Language Disorders and associated SEND conditions, by empowering them.

Set within thirty acres of the Surrey Hills Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and delivering a rich mainstream, academic curriculum, all of More House School's students take a breadth of GCSEs, and the majority enter the Sixth Form to study A' Levels and equivalent Level 3 BTECs.

The school is a leading player in teacher-education and development, offering short-courses and nationally-accredited qualifications in supporting learners in the classroom with Specific Learning Difficulties and Developmental Language Disorders. The school provides support to many professionals in other mainstream and specialist schools in the state-maintained and independent sectors.

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
